18th World Buiatrics Congress Bologna, Italy

August 29 — September 2, 1994

The 18th World Buiatrics Congress was held in conjunction with the 26th Italian Buiatrics Congress on August 29 — September 2, 1994 in Bologna, Italy. 1050 delegates and 130 accompanying persons from 42 countries participated in the scientific and social programs.

Many topics related to cattle diseases were presented in 168 oral and 171 poster communications. There were also 4 Satellite Symposia.

A highlight of the opening ceremony, under the presidency of Professor Jacques Espinasse, Toulouse, France was the presentation of the 1994 Pfizer Award for "Outstanding Contribution to the Advancement of Knowledge in the Origin and Treatment of Bovine Diseases Caused by Microorganisms." The recipient of the \$10,000 award was Dr. Paul-Pierre Pastoret, Liége, Belgium.

The Award was established in 1990 by Pfizer, Inc. in cooperation with the World Association for Buiatrics (WAB), with the recipient being selected by the Board of Directors of the WAB. It is presented biennially.

Professor Pastoret received the award for his outstanding research on bovine herpes virus 1. In 1981, his thesis on the latency of the virus was awarded "Agrégé de l'enseignment Supérieur" at the University of Liége and he also received the annual prize from the Royal Academy of Medicine in Belgium.

Professor Pastoret was the first to apply the technique of logical formalization in the field of infectious diseases and thus has been able to characterize the nature and pathogenesis of bovine herpes virus 1 *in vivo*.

Since this period, Professor Pastoret has been Head, Department of Virology-Immunology and Pathology of viral diseases at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Liége. He is the author and co-author of more than 490 scientific papers on veterinary virology and immunology. He is presently the chairman of the European Society for Veterinary Virology.

The Gustav Rosenberger Memorial Award was presented to Dr. S. Bolte, Dean of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Timisoara, Romania. He is also Head, Department of Veterinary Surgery. The \$7,500 award, now sponsored by SmithKline Beecham was established in 1982 in memory of Professor Doctor Gustav Rosenberger, Hannover, Germany, a founding member of WAB who served as Secretary-Treasurer of the organization for many years.

Dr. Bolte received the DVM degree in 1968 and the Ph.D. in 1979 from the Veterinary Faculty of Cluz, Romania. He is the author of 179 scientific papers and 5 textbooks. His research topics are anesthesiology, stress, shock and intensive therapy, operative techniques and veterinary acupuncture.

At the annual General Meeting on Friday, September 2, applications for membership in WAB from the following countries were approved: Austria, Denmark, India, New Zealand Society of Dairy Cattle Veterinarians; New Zealand Society of Sheep and Beef Cattle Veterinarians; Norway, Poland, Slovakia and Turkey.

The 19th World Buiatrics Congress will be held in Edinburgh, Scotland, U.K. on July 8-12, 1996 under the leadership of the British Cattle Veterinary Association. Further information may be received from Dr. C. Watson, Hon. Sec. BCVA, The Green, Frampton-on-Severn, Glos. GL 27ER, England.
