

Annual General Meeting

Tuesday, December 14, 1971

The Annual General Meeting of the American Association of Bovine Practitioners was held at the Denver Hilton Hotel, Denver, Colorado, on Tuesday, December 14, 1971, immediately following the noon luncheon. Dr. Irwin J. Collinge presided.

Dr. Harold E. Amstutz presented the financial report for the year ending December 31, 1970. He indicated that the bank balance on December 10, 1971, was \$21,356.43.

Dr. Samuel Hutchins, III, exhibits chairman, gave the exhibits financial report for the Denver meeting which showed a balance of \$10,946.89.

Dr. Eric Williams, editor, presented *The Bovine Practitioner* financial report.

Dr. Harold E. Amstutz was appointed executive secretary-treasurer.

It was decided to denote \$100 toward supporting a mycotoxin symposium which will be held one day prior to the 1972 AVMA Convention in New Orleans.

The status of the AABP preconditioning program was discussed. Canadian veterinarians will be invited to become District XII in the AABP. Dr. A. J. Koltveit was officially thanked for his advice and assistance to the organization.

The president was authorized to appoint a protocol and liaison committee and also a continuing education committee.

The possibility of an AABP sponsored tour to include the 1972 World Association for Buiatrics Meeting in London, July 31 - August 3, was discussed.

The following officers were elected for 1972: president, Dr. Francis Fox; president-elect, Dr. Ben Harrington; vice-president, Dr. L. Mac Cropsey; executive secretary-treasurer, Dr. Harold E. Amstutz; AVMA delegate, Dr. Maurice L. Weldy; alternate, Dr. Amstutz.

Dr. James A. Jarret, Rome, Georgia, was re-elected District 3 director.

Dr. Joseph W. Sexton, Ames, Iowa, was elected District 6 director.
Dr. Lloyd C. Faulkner, Fort Collins, Colorado, was elected District 9 director.

Dr. Maurice L. Weldy was nominated for the AVMA council on veterinary services representing food animal medicine.

Dr. Vernon L. Tharp was nominated for the AVMA council on education representing clinical services.

Dr. Ben Harrington will be the program director for the 1972 convention.
