Minutes of the American Association of Bovine Practitioners

Annual Business Luncheon

Saturday, September 16, 2017 Omaha Convention Center Omaha, Nebraska

The meeting was called to order by the AABP President, Dr. Mark Thomas at 12:25 pm. Dr. Thomas presented the minutes of the Charlotte Business Meeting for approval. On motion with a second, the minutes of the 2016 Annual Business Meeting was approved.

President Thomas introduced the current AABP Executive Committee and the VIP guests at the head table. Guests included Dr. Dick Wallace, Zoetis; Dr. Rick Sibbel, Merck Animal Health; Dr. Andy Bennett, Boehringer Ingelheim; Dr. Robert Rust, Agri-Labs; Dr. Andrew Cobner, British Cattle Veterinarians Association; Dr. Gabe Middleton, CAST liaison; and Dr. Mike Topper, AVMA President.

President Thomas acknowledged the Omaha Program Committee for their work. Incoming Vice-President Dr. Calvin Booker, Incoming District 4 Director Dr. Mark Hardesty, and Incoming District 7 Director Dr. Carl Meyer were introduced. Dr. Gary Koester and Dr. Rodney Chapman were recognized and thanked for their service as outgoing directors. Retiring committee chairs Dr. Jim Floyd and Dr. Mike Sanderson were also recognized by President Thomas for their service to the AABP.

Dr. Thomas recognized the districts, foreign attendees, students, veterinary technicians, and accompanying persons.

Dr. Bryan Halteman, the AABP treasurer, was introduced to present the treasurer's report to the membership. He reported that the CPA firm of Machen, McChesney and Chastain, LLP, completed a satisfactory audit of AABP financials for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2016. They found no material weaknesses. The AABP is in a strong financial position. On motion with a second, the Treasurer's Report was approved.

AABP Executive Vice-President, Dr. Fred Gingrich, reported on the successful meeting and recognized the sponsors of the annual conference events. The 50th AABP Annual Conference had a record high attendance with 1432 registrations including 384 students, 137 AASRP members, 32 graduate students, 5 veterinary technicians, 150 accompanying persons, and 447 exhibitors for a total attendance of 2,029 from the United States, Canada, and 17 foreign countries. A total of \$211,500 in scholarships and travel stipends were awarded at the conference. These scholarships that support veterinary students and


