The Jubilee 10th International Symposium on Lameness in Ruminants is to take place in September 1998 in Switzerland. It will be held in two different places.

Friday the 4th and Saturday the 5th of September are planned as "Large animal lameness days" in conjunction with the Annual Meeting of the Swiss Society of Veterinarians, in Interlaken in the Bernese Oberland. Diverse speakers will be invited to provide an interesting programme primarily for practitioners from Switzerland and the neighbouring countries. The main language will be German, important papers may be presented in English or French.

On Sunday 6th September those attending the Interlaken Meeting will experience an attractive excursion on the way to Lucerne where the welcome reception for the International Symposium will take place in the evening. The actual Symposium will commence on Monday in the Casino, Lucerne and will last 3 to 4 days. The conference language will be English.

We plan to offer a programme with a wide spectrum from all fields associated with lameness in the ruminant. Not only will the opportunity be provided for

participants to present their work in talks and posters but, something new, there will be workshop reports. For this purpose we have already selected approximately half a dozen major topics and workshop leaders. They now have time to work with a chosen team of colleagues towards the aim of presenting their conclusions on the state of the art in their respective fields at a round table discussion during the meeting.

This letter is designed to whet your appetite for a visit to Switzerland in 1998 and to give you ample time to plan your absence from home, which hopefully will not be restricted to the days of the Symposium. Lucerne and Interlaken are very picturesque and beautifully situated towns. Switzerland is small and any place in the country can be reached within hours. Furthermore, we already know that the Lucerne International Music Festival will be in full swing at that time.
