The XIIth World Congress on Diseases of Cattle will be held in the International Congrescentrum RAI, Amsterdam, The Netherlands, on September 7-10, 1982. The Congress will be organized by the Dutch Buiatrics Association in collaboration with the World Association for Buiatrics.

The Congress director is Dr. H. J. Breukink, Utrecht.

Introductory lectures on each theme will be given by international specialists. The preliminary scientific programme reads as follows:

Theme 1: Respiratory diseases of cattle: aetiology, treatment and control.

- 1.1. Pulmonary lesions in young bovines and their clinical significance.
- 1.2. Epidemiology of respiratory diseases in bovine and its consequences for prevention.
- 1.3. Evaluation of vaccination programmes against IBR, PI₃ and Pasteurellae.
- 1.4. Evaluation of vaccination programmes against BRS.

Theme 2: Gastro-intestinal disturbances in calves during the neonatal and weaning periods.

- 2.1. Viral enteritis in calves, pathological and clinical aspects.

- 2.2. Bacterial etiology of enteritis.
 - 2.3. Pathophysiology and treatment of diarrhoea in calves.
- Theme 3:** Metabolic diseases in high yielding dairy cattle and their influences on milk quality, performance and fertility.
- 3.1. Fat mobilisation and liver function of high yielding dairy cows in early lactation.
 - 3.2. Metabolic diseases and their influences on milk quality.
- Theme 4:** The use of computerised recording in herd health management.
- Theme 5:** Bovine surgery.
- 5.1. Abdominal surgery.
 - 5.2. Surgical diseases of the musculoskeletal system.
- Theme 6:** Diseases of the central nervous system.
- Theme 7:** Infectious skin diseases of the udder and teats.
- Theme 8:** Research in tropical diseases in the bovine in Western Europe.
- 8.1. Disease problems, associated with the introduction of European cattle in the Tropics.
 - 8.2. Diseases of the central nervous system under tropical conditions.
 - 8.3. Immunology of tropical diseases, diagnosis and prevention.

The city of Amsterdam has been selected as the site of this Congress. It is the historical and beautiful

capital of the Netherlands. After you have done the Amsterdam-tour, it is worthwhile to visit the rest of the country. Holland offers you a lot of castles, many of them visitable, romantic canals and of course windmills and wooden shoes. Museums are everywhere, shopping is sumptuous and the scene would not be complete without the famous street organs.

Another side of the picture is the Dutch agricultural life, based on modern principles, prosperous cattle-breeding and a wide interest in animal life. The well known, newly constructed veterinary school in Utrecht will undoubtedly be of interest to many veterinarians.

Finally Schiphol, Amsterdam-airport, homebase of KLM and one of the most efficient airports in Europe, provides connections to all parts of the Continent. It can be used as a first step to other famous parts of Europe.

It goes without saying that an accompanying-persons programme will provide — besides the social events of the Congress — an excellent opportunity to obtain a good impression of Holland and the Dutch.

Anyone who wishes to contribute to the scientific programme by presenting a paper, may send an abstract of his paper with a maximum of 300 words to the Congress Secretariat before December 1st, 1981. Abstracts have to be submitted in one of the Congress languages English, French or German. A typed abstract plus 2 copies is desired.
