The 11th International Congress on Diseases of Cattle will be held in Tel Aviv, Israel on October 20-23, 1980. The Congress is organized by the Israel Association for Buiatrics in conjunction with the World Association for Buiatrics. The Congress president is Dr. E. Mayer, Haifa.

The preliminary scientific program includes papers on coliform mastitis, viral and post-vaccination abortion, chlamydial abortion, ethology, blood parasitoses, (theilosis, babesiosis and estous synchronization, hormone therapy, uses and abuses, miscellaneous).

The Scientific Committee invites papers relative to these topics. Summaries not more than 200 words, must be submitted in 3 of the 5 official languages, one of which must be in English. These must be sent in triplicate to the scientific panel by December 31, 1979. Authors of submitted summaries will be notified by January 15, 1980 of their acceptance and should then submit 3 copies of their completed paper by April 1, 1980. Send airmail to Dr. E. Mayer, P. O. ***Diseases of Feedlot Cattle* Third Edition**

Vastly superior in both content and style to earlier editions, this third edition is completely new, revised, and rewritten for succinct presentation. New chapters in this edition cover papular stomatitis, bronchiectasis, pulmonary embolic aneurysm, clumped ruminal papillae, otitis media, endocarditis, hemopericardium, bulling, saline water toxicity, urea poisoning, arthropathies, and rectal prolapse. Although the text emphasizes diseases of the respiratory and digestive tracts, it includes all major and most minor diseases and classifies them into categories caused by viruses, rickettsia and chlamydia, bacteria, fungi, protozoan and metazoan parasites, and miscellaneous and unknown factors. Diseases caused by overcrowding are presented. "Thoroughly revised, and with new sections on 13 diseases not covered previously, this already important work has become even more indispensable to feedlot and other bovine practitioners." —*Modern Veterinary Practice*.

***Keeping Livestock Healthy* A Veterinary Guide by N. Bruce Haynes, D.V.M.**

Keeping Livestock Healthy is based on the premise that the vast majority of livestock health problems can be prevented.

Dr. Haynes goes on to explain the nature of the disease process, and outlines methods of preventing illnesses in the major farm animal species.

Keeping Livestock Healthy consists of two sections. Part One deals with practical preventive medicine, and emphasizes the importance of adequate nutrition, proper environment and housing, judicious use of biologics, sound management practices and reliance on professional input.

Part Two describes diseases common to horses, sheep, swine, goats, and dairy and beef cattle. This part covers infectious, parasitic, metabolic and foreign animal diseases. The text is complemented by many high-quality photographs and drawings. *Keeping Livestock Healthy* also contains a comprehensive list of reading references, a glossary of medical terms and an all exclusive index.

Veterinary Medicine: A Textbook of the diseases of Cattle, Sheep, Pigs and Horses, 5th ed.

The Fifth Edition of this extremely popular book has been extensively revised and updated, and considerably enlarged. Sections dealing with diseases of swine, parasitic diseases, poisoning by anthelmintics and pesticides, principles of antimicrobial therapy, equine colic, diseases of the newborn, fluid, electrolyte and acid base balance, ruminant forestomachs, nervous and musculoskeletal systems, and etiologically-specific diseases are either completely new to this edition, or have been thoroughly revised or rewritten.

This is an important reference book for any practitioner.
